Call to Order 19:00

- Roll Call Taken
- Minutes of the November 2017 meeting were approved.
 - A member of the public, Mr. Johnathan Wang, objected to the summarizing in the minutes of the exchange at the November meeting between members of the Board and members of the public regarding the appropriate reaction to a dislike of aircraft noise.

Noise Monitor Report: *John Inserra (AvPORTS)*:

- **October**

The airport received a total of 1,822 noise complaints from 96 households.

 - The lead caller sent in 346 complaints
 - 25 households sent in 10 or more complaints
 - 171 complaints were received during the VRFF
 - 121 were HPN traffic, 27 were non-HPN traffic, and 23 were unidentified
 - 16 New York municipalities, and 2 Connecticut municipalities
 - There were a total of 315 operations during the VRFF.
 - There were three high range noise events.
- **November:**

The airport received a total of 1,807 noise complaints from 62 households.

 - The lead caller sent in 221 complaints
 - 24 households sent in 10 or more complaints
 - 163 complaints were received during the VRFF
 - 93 were HPN traffic, 42 were non-HPN traffic, and 28 were unidentified
 - 14 New York municipalities, and 1 Connecticut municipality
 - There were a total of 285 operations during the VRFF.
 - There were no high range noise events.
- ***Peter Schlactus:*** Are the complaints that described as being during the VRFF just complaints that are received during the VRFF or complaints about aircraft during that time period regardless of when they are received?
 - ***John Inserra (AvPORTS):*** They are complaints about aircraft during that time period no matter what time the noise office received the complaint.
- **December:**

The airport received a total of 1,743 noise complaints from 57 households.

 - The lead caller sent in 857 complaints
 - 28 households sent in 10 or more complaints
 - 154 complaints were received during the VRFF
 - 93 were HPN traffic, 38 were non-HPN traffic, and 23 were unidentified

- 10 New York municipalities and 1 Connecticut municipality
- There were a total of 231 operations during the VRFF
- There were 4 high range noise events
- Guy in back, Robert Fleisher
- **Peter Schlactus:** Is there any outreach done to the high volume complainers?
 - **John Inserra (AvPORTS):** If requested, the airport will conduct noise studies using temporary noise monitors placed at the citizen's home. If they contact the office by telephone, we will discuss the issue with them and try to find out as much information as possible about their situation.
- **Nancy Barr:** Is the airport mandated to do this?
 - **Bob Funicello**
 - In the 1980s as commercial traffic at the airport increased the, County attempted to implement a hard curfew at the airport with the same hours as the VRFF. This resulted in a lawsuit against the County by Midway Airlines (Midway Airlines Inc. v. County of Westchester). The federal court ruled that the County had not demonstrated that it had a noise problem that needed to be addressed. The noise monitoring program was set up in order to gather data to support that position. In addition, we use the noise monitors to calibrate the FAA model that is used to determine the change in noise impact that will occur if changes in airport facilities are contemplated. If you look at the noise data that is published each month, you do not see any significant change that would result in the significant increase in complaints.
 - What is the goal of collecting the data?
 - **Bob Funicello**
 - Under the Airport Noise and Capacity Act of 1990 airport operators cannot impose restrictions on operations unless it goes through a FAR Part 161 noise study. At this time, Naples is the only airport that has successfully done so. We work with aircraft operators to minimize the airport's impact on the community on a voluntary basis.
- **Johnathan Wang:** It was reported the airport was forced to delay sending out the report on a noise study by the previous administration. Are there other reports that are not being sent out?
 - **Mr. Inserra:** No.
- **Mr. Daniel Cremins** initiated a discussion acknowledging that there is noise and that it is an issue for the community, but that the airport and the County don't have any power to do anything about it and asked if there was anybody present who could offer a solution. **Mr. Robert Fleisher,** stated that they needed more information about what was happening and why before they could make suggestions and that he had requested

additional information about the amount of aircraft using Runway 16 on a year-over-year basis, and stated that without digging into the data available.

- A resident asked if there was a way to limit the number of corporate jets using the airport. *Mr. Funicello* explained that under the Airport Noise and Capacity Act of 1990 the airport can't place restrictions on aircraft operations at a public airport.
- *Mr. Schur* requested that the staff point out on the map the location of the high volume complainers. *Mr. Quail* provided the general location of the high volume caller in the Whipoorwill section of Armonk.
- *Mr. Wang* suggested that the County make the airport less attractive to prospective users and that improvements such as Million Air's new facilities and Flexjet taking over Hangar F and that he did not believe the claims that additional facilities would reduce the number of aircraft conducting ferry flights to other regional airports. *Mr. Santomero* responded that traffic is not driven by the quality of the facilities but by the community being served. A discussion followed on Mr. Wang's suggestions regarding, posting of signage, improving the noise abatement section of the airport's website, placing of literature at FBOs explaining the procedures.

Public Comment:

- *Allen Williams*: Can the Board elaborate on reports about contamination from firefighting foam in wells on New King Street?

- *Vincent Kopicki*: We are working with the DEC, we have monitoring wells in place, we are in the process of verifying the findings. Once it has been verified, we will work with the DEC to establish what the next steps are.
- Will there be any testing done on wells that are used by home owners in the area?
 - *Vincent Kopicki*: That will be determined after the findings are validated.
 - *Bob Funicello*: Once the extent and nature of the contamination has been determined a remediation plan will be developed for the areas that are affected.
- *Nancy Barr*:
 - Has the Corp of Engineers issued the permits for the Basin dredging project?
 - *Bob Funicello*: I believe the permits have been issued.
 - There is a mention in the minutes of the last meeting of a tree trimming project?
 - It's a continual maintenance project.
 - Calibration of noise monitors?
 - *Christopher Quail*: The noise monitors receive an annual preventative maintenance that includes calibration of the analyzer and microphone. This is done by Barry Technologies under the airport's contract with Brüel & Kjær - Environment Management Solutions for the ANOMS system. This is part of the airport's AEMS Program.
 - Detention Basin Project - is this the same as the Basin B project?
 - *Hugh Fox*: It is a maintenance project to remove silt and increase the capacity of the basins. The project is now underway.
 - *Peter Schlactus*: The result of this project will abate the runoff of deicing fluid?
 - *Hugh Fox*: Yes.
- *Tim Halpern*:
 - Mr. Halpern did not like the answer that he received in the noise study that the airport conducted at his home. He feels that the airport's monitoring equipment is woefully inadequate and does not show the level of sound penetration that he experiences.
- *Tracey Levy*:
 - We have seen a dramatic increase in soot on our deck. Isn't there anything that can be done considering that the reservoir is located next to the airport.
- *Robert Fleisher*:
 - Are there any projects other than the Million Air construction and Textron/NetJets lease transfer that we should be aware of?
 - *Nancy Barr*: We are looking into that; any new projects would have to come before the Board of Legislators. We are working to improve the transparency of the process. There are 8 years of pent up projects, and we are working toward addressing the many issues facing the County.
 - *Hugh Fox*: The only other project that is currently outstanding is the planned refurbishment of the loading dock at the main terminal.

- ***Christina Lee:***
 - Would like someone to talk to pilots about altitudes on approach and would like there to be follow-up with FAA.
- ***Elizabeth Meladossi :***
 - Expressed concern about low altitudes of aircraft on approach to the airport and would like some action to be taken.

RE: WESTCHESTER COUNTY AIRPORT ACTIVITY FOR DECEMBER 2017 - REVISED

1. Movements

Aircraft movements for December 2017 totaled 11,438, up 11.0% from December 2016. Jet movements for December were 7,146, up 9.3% from the same month of the previous year.

2. Alerts	1	Year-to-date	16
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There was one aircraft alert during the month of December.

The Pilot in Command (PIC) of a Canadair Regional scheduled service passenger jet aircraft, while inbound to HPN, reported a failure to the aircraft's number 1 engine. PIC made a decision to shut down the engine and declared an emergency. Aircraft landed safely on Runway 34 and taxied to the ramp. Upon inspection, there were no injuries to the passengers or crew, and no smoke, damage or bird remains detected. PIC later stated that the aircraft actually experienced a failure to the number 1 engine's "thrust reverser". Upon the onset of the incident, Airport Operations activated HPN's Aircraft Emergency Response "Alert Level 3" with WCDDES 60 Fire Control.

Wildlife Control Log: Westchester County Airport Operations documented one (1) Aircraft Bird Strike during the month of December. This strike involved a jetBlue Airbus A320 aircraft just after departure from Runway 34 and occurred at around 1,600' above the ground. This incident did cause substantial damage to the aircraft's nose and number 2 engine, and as a precaution the PIC diverted the aircraft to JFK where it landed safely with no injuries reported. JFK's USDA Wildlife Biologist collected snarge samples that were sent to the Smithsonian for Bird Identification. Additionally for 2017, the total number of strikes at HPN is 58. Also, during this month of December, the airport's USDA Wildlife Biologist harassed over 500 European Starlings and confirmed that coyotes were gaining airfield access.
