7:03 – Meeting called to order by Chairman Rocco Turso.

7:04 – Pledge of Allegiance

7:05 – Approval of minutes from previous meeting (January 24, 2018)

7:06 – Noise Monitoring Report – Modified report given by Peter Scherrer

- Jan. 2018 – Total of 1,813 complaints (21 households called in 653 complaints; lead caller called in 1,160 which accounts for 64%).
- Feb. 2018 – Total of 1,616 complaints (21 households called in 663 complaints; lead caller called in 953 which accounts for 59%).
- Mar. 2018 – Total of 1,697 complaints (21 households called in 405 complaints; lead caller called in 1,297 which accounts for 76%).
 - Noise complaint numbers contain a combination of calls & emails.
- Acknowledged that noise complaint response to the community has been late due to the high volume of complaints and efforts are being taken to address this issue. Noise intern will be starting in May to help process noise complaints, as well as extra hours for Environmental Department.
- Suggestions from community members to use PlaneNoise website for noise complaints, as well as tracking frequency of aircraft flying over certain area instead of just tracking decibels).
- Will also investigate the future use of a web based system to address this issue.

7:14 – Commissioner Greechan gave the WCDPW&T project report.

Airport Master Plan (substantially complete; currently under review with FAA).

- Runway 16/34 Rehab Project (90% done; scheduled for 2019)
- Hangar E Parking Lot Rehab (75% done)
- Terminal Systems Upgrade
- Basin B Dredging & Storm Water Management Upgrade (in progress)
- Tower Road Rehab (coordinated with Million Air facility construction)
- Million Air 2nd Hangar construction is on hold as project is being evaluated by the County (no significant environmental impact found).
- Community comments/concerns:
 - Concerns about lack of detailed environmental impact statement for new Million Air hangar. Concerned about lease agreement in lifting the aircraft weight restriction.
 - Questions about completion status of Airport Master Plan and lack of public comments and relevance to community needs.
 - Concerns about denied request from DPW office for environmental impact statement about proposed snow removal shed on north end of airport.
 - Questions about total number of operations on Runway 16/34 vs 11/29
 - Is the airport going to lose the grant money for the Master Plan? Does the WC Board of Legislators approve the Master Plan?

- Will the data in the Master Plan be updated? The data collected indicates the year 2012.
- Runway 16: 47,043 operations; Runway 34: 73,917 operations; Runway 11: 6,620 operations; Runway 29: 7,297 operations; (Runway 11/29 accounts for approximately 10% of total aircraft operations).

7:43 – Old Business from Jan. 24th meeting

- Follow-up meeting planned for water contamination found in Greenwich wells (out of 8 wells tested; 2 showed higher-than-normal level of contamination). Told not to drink the water.
- Questions about website development (waiting on approval from new administration to update and post documents).
- Concerns about not being able to find Airport Advisory Board meeting dates.

7:52 – New Business

- Article in Wall Street Journal about the “antidote to noisy airports”
 - The advent of GPS led to more aircraft to going over a particular point in space with more accuracy, causing more congestion over certain areas.
- Request for County representative to take minutes (as opposed to airport employees).

7:56 – Opening Floor to Public Comments

- Aircraft noise on WebTrak tracking website is being mistakenly categorized for community noise.
 - Concerns brought up about whether this public information being used as a basis for HPN noise reports.
 - Requests for noise monitor locations to be reviewed and replaced as necessary to avoid picking up street noise.
- Pleasantville and North Castle residents expressing concerns about frequency of aircraft on final approach flying over the neighborhood (as often as every 2 minutes; curfew is broken every night).
 - Theory brought up that larger aircraft have begun flying in and out of the airport, which may contribute to increased noise complaints.
- 2018 year-to-date: Corporate jet traffic decreased while single-engine GA has increased.
- NetJets and late-night/early-morning commercial flights comprise most of the traffic that break the noise abatement curfew

RE: WESTCHESTER COUNTY AIRPORT ACTIVITY FOR MARCH 2018 - REVISED

1. Movements

Aircraft movements for March 2018 totaled 11,803, up 9.5% from March 2017. Jet movements for March were 6,593, down 1.3% from the same month of the previous year.

2. Alerts 4 Year-to-date 5

There were four aircraft alerts during the month of March.

The Pilot in Command (PIC) of Cirrus SR-22 GTS Single Engine Private Propeller Aircraft reported an electronic loss of cockpit instruments and gauges while on final approach to Runway 16. Aircraft landed safely and taxied to the ramp.

PIC of a Bombardier Global 6000 private jet aircraft reported a hydraulic system failure while inbound to HPN. Aircraft landed safely on Runway 34 and taxied to ramp.

PIC of an Embraer EMB-190 Scheduled Service Commercial Aircraft reported a cockpit indication of a malfunction with the aircraft's steering system while inbound to HPN. Aircraft landed safely on Runway 16 and PIC was able to turn off of Runway 16 using opposing jet thrust. Aircraft was then towed back to the main terminal ramp by the airport's tug team.

PIC of a Learjet LR60XR private jet engine aircraft reported smoke in the cockpit and declared an emergency while performing test flight from Farmingdale Republic Airport (FRG). Aircraft landed safely on Runway 16 and taxied to the ramp under its own power. During this incident, Airport Operations activated an Alert Level 2 Emergency Response with 60 Control.

Wildlife Control Log: Westchester County Airport Operations recorded two (2) Aircraft Bird and Wildlife Strikes during March. Both strikes involved small birds resulting in no damage to the aircraft. Airport Operations collected snarge samples that were sent to the Smithsonian for identification. Also, in the month of March, the USDA Wildlife Biologist and Airport Operations harassed and dispersed over 700 European Starlings from the airfield.

Westchester County Airport Operations activated the Runway 16 Special Authorization Category II Aircraft Approach once for a total time of approximately 3 hours and 30 minutes during the month of March.

6. Construction

- The Terminal's new electric room project is still on hold by the County.
- The dredging of Basin B work continues. Minimal work was accomplished in March due to the weather.
- The storm water project, expansion of Basins A, B and Outfall 7, construction continues. Minimal work was accomplished in March due to the weather.
- Hangar D pumphouse – the replacement of piping work is underway.
- Westchester Joint Water Works has completed the connection of the 20" fire line to Hangar E pumphouse to their 36" transmission line at Purchase Street and Tower Road. They are waiting for the meter pit vault to be delivered before the remaining work can be completed.
- The new IP telephones were installed by the County throughout the airport.
- The contracts were approved for security cameras, intercoms, and GO-READER, as well as the fiber installation for Hangar F.
- The bids were received and approved for three electric pushbacks.

1. Movements

Aircraft movements for April 2018 totaled 12,178, down 8.5% from April 2017. Jet movements for April were 6,742, down 7.5% from the same month of the previous year.

There was one aircraft alert during the month of April.

The Pilot in Command (PIC) of a Bombardier Global Express BD-700 private jet aircraft reported a Partial Wing Flap Failure (for Pitch Control) while inbound to HPN. Aircraft landed safely on Runway 34 and taxied to ramp.

Wildlife Control Log: Westchester County Aircraft recorded three (3) Aircraft Bird and Wildlife Strikes during April. Two of the strikes involved American Kestrels and the other was identified by the Smithsonian as a Yellow-Bellied Sapsucker. All strikes resulted in no damage to the aircraft or any deviation from normal aircraft operations. The 2018 strike total is currently at five (5). Also, in the month of April, the USDA Wildlife Biologist and Airport Operations harassed and dispersed over 130 European Starlings from the airfield.

6. Construction

- The Terminal's new electric room project is still on hold by the County.
- The dredging of Basin B work continues.
- The storm water project, expansion of Basins A, B and Outfall 7, construction continues.
- Hangar D pumphouse – the replacement of piping continues, and the contractor is still waiting for the check valve to complete his work.
- Westchester Joint Water Works will continue when meter pit vault is delivered. The estimated completion is the end of May.
- The security cameras and intercoms are installed and working. ADCO Electric started the fiber installation for Hangar F.
- The three electric pushbacks are on order and the two diesel pushbacks were approved and order is being processed.

Westchester County Airport Operations activated the Runway 16 Special Authorization Category II Aircraft Approach three (3) times for a total running time of approximately 8 hours and 25 minutes during the month of May.

- The Terminal's new electric room project is still on hold by the County.
- The dredging of Basin B work continues.
